

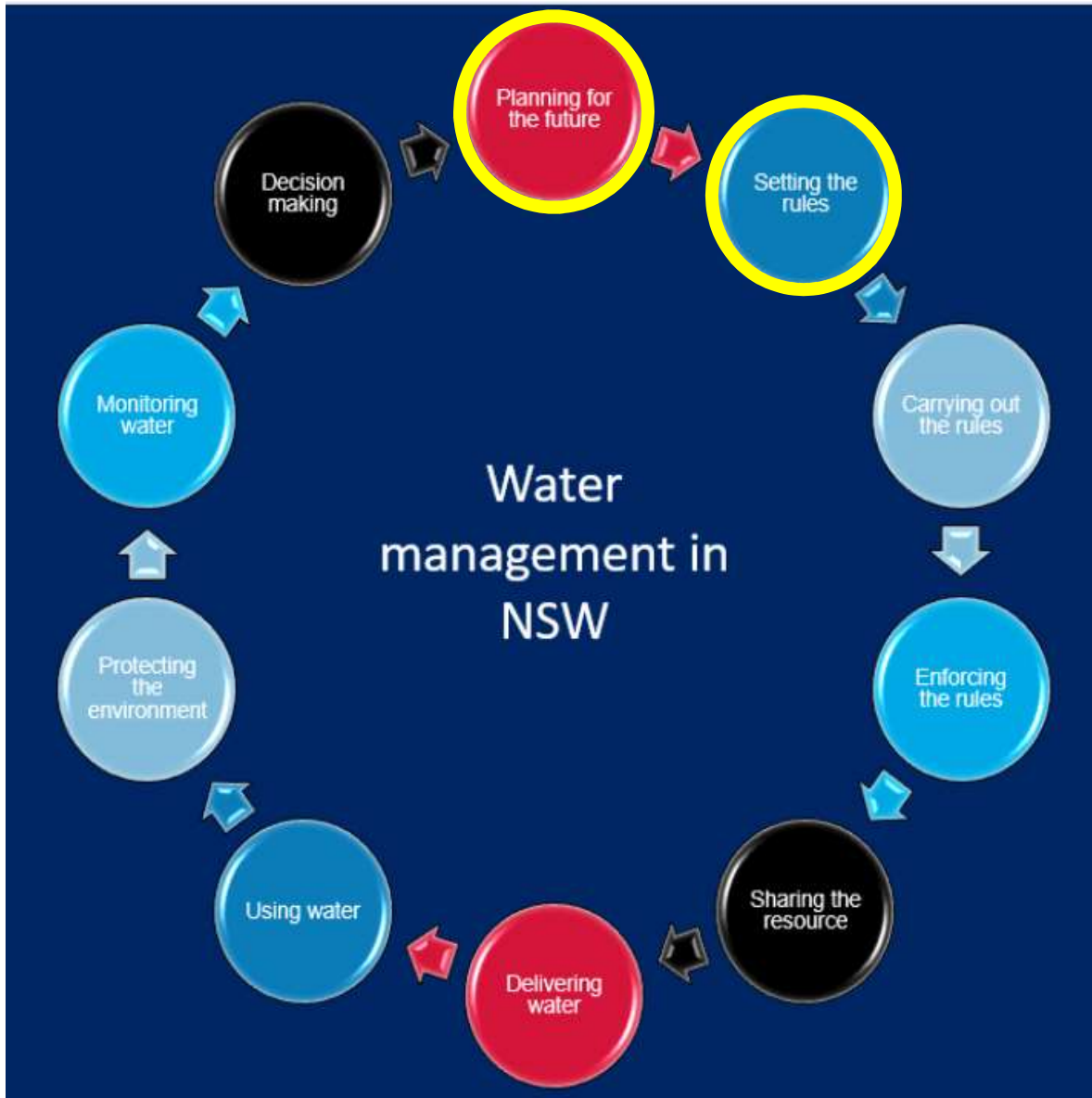

Establishing rights to water without a licence

Incorporates cultural objectives and opportunities for access



Limiting how much water users can take from rivers, lakes and groundwater under a licence

Secures water needs for ecosystem health



Setting rules for when licence holders can take water

Specifies rules and conditions to minimise impacts



Sets rules for water accounts and trading

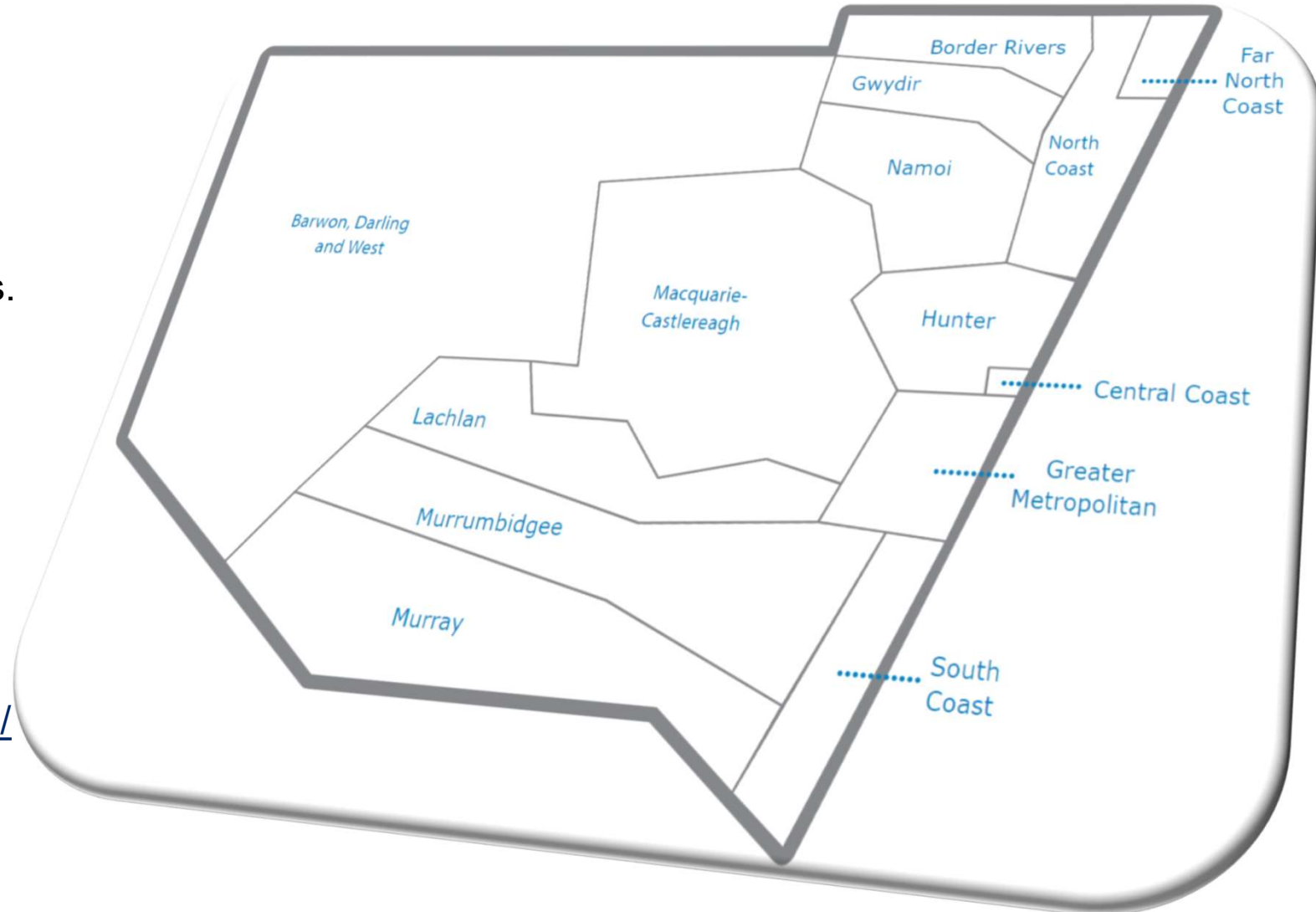
Provides security for 10 years



Water Sharing Plan

Status

- 61 water sharing plans across 14 regions.
- 35 inland and 26 on the coastal water sharing plans.
- 23 coastal water sharing plans due for replacement in next five years.
- Plans are independently reviewed by the Natural Resources Commission

Central Coast region



The Central Coast region covers an area of more than 1560km² and consists of two distinct areas: Tuggerah Lake and its tributaries (Wyong River, Ourimbah Creek and Jiliby Jiliby Creeks) and the Hawkesbury River and its tributaries Mangrove Creek and Mooney Mooney Creek systems. This region is the traditional lands of the Darkinjung people.
