

Traffic management—Frequently asked questions

What roads will be used for trucks to transport plant, equipment and construction materials to the worksite?

For the duration of construction, vehicles travelling to and from the worksite at the Breakwater Wharf will use Mitchell, Calle Calle, Chandos, Barclay, Museum, Imlay and Weecoon Streets and Albert Terrace. Vehicles leaving the project will also use Wirriga Street during peak school zone times.

All workers on the project and regular suppliers (such as concrete trucks) shall undertake a project-specific induction to ensure drivers are aware of the permitted traffic routes.

Where possible, construction materials will arrive by marine vessels and unload at the Port of Eden.




Figure 1. Aerial map of proposed traffic routes

How many trucks a day will there be?

It is anticipated that there will be up to twenty truck movements per day.

Will there be any changes to the roads at the Port of Eden during construction?

No. Access will be maintained to the port for commercial and recreational users including visiting cruise ships. This excludes the Breakwater Wharf project site area, which has been closed since August 2017 and will reopen at project completion in mid-2019.

Will there be any changes to local roads during construction?

No. There will be no changes to local roads for the duration of the project unless advised by Bega Valley Shire Council.

Will there be any changes to speed limits on local roads?

No. There will be no changes to speed limits on local roads for the duration of the project unless advised by Bega Valley Shire Council. The project will ensure that heavy vehicles keep within legal speed limits to ensure the safety and amenity of the community and road users, and to minimise traffic disruptions.

Will there be any changes when cruise ships are visiting?

No. A Traffic and Pedestrian Access Plan has been prepared and is implemented specifically on days when cruise ships are visiting the port. There will be no changes to the existing arrangements that are in place.
