Namoi Valley

Water allocation update – to end March 2017

Allocations

Rainfall during March produced minor inflows to storage from upstream tributaries. However, there was insufficient resource improvement to provide an allocation increase.

The Lower Namoi general security allocation therefore remains unchanged at 124.67 per cent of entitlement

All other licence categories in the Lower and Upper Namoi valleys have already received their maximum allocation for the 2016/17 water year.

Dam levels (as at 5 April 2017)

- Keepit Dam is 61 per cent full steady holding 263,000 megalitres (ML) compared to 10 per cent full at the same time last year.
- Split Rock Dam is 30 per cent full steady holding 121,000 ML, compared to 5 per cent full at the same time last year.

Key facts

- Essential supplies are secure for 2017/18.
- Modest inflows from the Peel Valley, combined with licensed environmental water releases from Keepit storage, are contributing to flows and riverine health outcomes along the length of the river to Walgett.
- Irrigation demand over winter is expected to remain low, with remaining water in accounts carried over for summer crop requirements.
- End of system targets in the next three months will likely be met from downstream tributaries and weir pools, allowing water to be conserved in Keepit Dam.
- A return to block release strategies is not anticipated in the foreseeable future, however; if dry conditions should occur for an extended period, consideration will be given to management options that will extend the longevity of critical supplies.

Seasonal rainfall outlook

According to the Bureau of Meteorology, April is more likely to have above average rainfall in the eastern and central portions of the catchment with average rainfall more likely in the western portion. April daytime temperatures are forecast to be below average.

The overall three month forecast from April to June indicates close to average rainfall and daytime temperatures in the eastern portion of the catchment, transitioning to below average rainfall and warmer than average daytime temperatures in the western portion of the catchment.

Although the El Niño-Southern Oscillation (ENSO) remains neutral, climate models suggest El Niño conditions are likely to develop during winter. The Bureau notes caution should be exercised as models have lower accuracy at this time of year in forecasting El Niño.

El Niño is often, but not always, associated with below average winter-spring rainfall over eastern Australia and warmer than average winter-spring maximum temperatures over the southern half of Australia.



Notes:

- ⁽¹⁾ Available Resource (369 GL) includes total active storage (Split Rock & Keepit Dams).
- Storage Losses –evaporation loss based on forecast storage behaviour and maximum historical evaporation rates over 2 years.
- Essential Supplies water required to be set aside under water sharing plans to provide for Towns, Stock, Domestic, High Security and riverine environments. Includes Gunidgera/Pian stock and domestic replenishments, delivery loss allowance and end-of-system flow requirements. This commitment is offset by minimum forecast inflows into the storages.
- Peel Trade Account the Peel water sharing plan, at Clause 86(4), provides for limited allocation assignment (temporary trade) from the Peel to the Namoi valleys. It requires a volume to be set aside in Keepit resources equal to the AWD times 3,000 to support trade from the Peel valley. The trade account balance reduces as trade water is released from storage. The account increases with increases to Lower Namoi general security allocation. The current account balance is zero all traded water has been delivered.
