

Eden Breakwater Wharf Extension Project

Information for recreational fishers

Jointly funded by the Australian Government, New South Wales Government and Bega Valley Shire Council, the \$44 million Eden Breakwater Wharf Extension Project is an important multi-government initiative to drive economic growth in the region.

About the project

Snug Cove, in the Port of Eden, is becoming a popular destination with an increasing number of cruise ship stop overs. The Eden Breakwater Wharf Extension Project will allow cruise ships up to 325 metres to berth at the wharf once completed. Construction commenced in August 2017 and includes:

- dredging of up to 230,000 cubic meters of material to improve access
- installation of scour protection on the seabed
- extending the existing wharf by approximately 110 metres
- installation of berthing and mooring dolphins
- installation of landside bollards
- installation of minor services (lighting, power and potable water).

Dredging and scour protection works have been completed under stage one of the project and stage two marine structures has commenced. Piling rigs and other equipment that will be used during stage two will be located at the worksite on the existing wharf and on barges adjacent to the wharf in Snug Cove. An exclusion zone of 50 metres will be in place around the barge and wharf.

Breakwater Wharf closure

The Breakwater Wharf has been closed to the public since August 2017 and a secure worksite established to ensure the safety of the public and the contractors for the duration of the project.

Recreational fishing is not permitted at the Breakwater Wharf while it is closed. The Breakwater Wharf will reopen when the project is completed in mid-2019 and the public will be advised in advance.

The Mooring Jetty and Multi-purpose Jetty remain open to the public.
