Opening water allocations for Clarence Valley users

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment today announced available water determinations for Clarence Valley water users for the new 2019-20 water year, commencing 1 July 2019.

Domestic and stock, local water utility, unregulated river and aquifer water access licence holders on the Aberfoyle, Angourie-Redcliff and Sandon, Boyd, Cataract, Esk River, Guy Fawkes, Henry, Little Nymboida, Lower Mann, Lower Nymboida, Lower Orara, Lower Timbarra, Maryland, Mid Mann, Mid Nymboida, Mid Orara, Upper Mann, Upper Orara, Upper Timbarra, Wooli, Sara-Oban and Yarrow rivers, Acacia, Alamy, Bookookoorara, Boonoo Boonoo, Bottle, Bucca Bucca, Coldstream, Coombadjha, Copmanhurst-Lower Mid Clarence, Dandahra, Deep-Tunglebung, Demon, Duck, Koreelah, Paddys Flat-Upper Clarence, Peacock, Plumbago, Sportsman and Stockyard, Swan, The Gorges-Upper Mid Clarence, Tooloom, Waspool creeks, Clarence Coastal, Clarence tidal pool and Wooloweyah Lake receive an allocation of 100 per cent of entitlement or 1 megalitre per unit share.

Domestic and stock, local water utility and unregulated river water access licence holders on the Bielsdown, Blinks, Upper Nymboida rivers and Wild Cattle Creek receive an allocation of 100 per cent of entitlement or 1 megalitre per unit share.

Aquifer water access licence holders who draw from the Clarence River coastal floodplain alluvial groundwater source receive 1 megalitre per unit share.
