Opening water allocations for Tweed Valley users

The NSW Department of Planning, Industry and Environment today announced available water determinations for water users in the Tweed Valley water sources for the new 2019-20 water year, commencing 1 July 2019.

All water access licence holders who draw water from the unregulated, alluvial and groundwater water sources covered by the Tweed River area unregulated and alluvial water sharing plan, receive an allocation of 100 per cent of entitlement or 1 megalitre per unit share of entitlement.

Water sources covered by this plan include; Upper Tweed River, Mid Tweed River, Burringbar River, Lower Oxley River, Mid Rous River, Upper Oxley River, Upper Rous River, Bilambil Creek, Brays Creek, Byrrill Creek, Christies Creek, Clothiers Creek, Cobaki Creek, Crystal Creek, Cudgera Creek, Doon Doon Creek, Dunbible Creek, Dungay Creek, Duroby Creek, Hopping Dicks Creek, Mooball Creek, Nobbys Creek, Piggabeen Creek, Dumpenbil Creek, Rolands Creek, Sheens Creek, Smiths Creek, Terranora Broadwater, Tweed Estuary, Cobaki Broadwater and Cudgen Lake.
